#### Christ the King

With Christmas just over a month away, Christ the King Sunday is a day to pause and remember that the infant Jesus in the manger, whose birth we

are preparing to celebrate, is now the risen, ascended and enthroned Christ the King.

Christ rules in heaven, but not yet over all the earth. - That is why we are led to pray, "Your kingdom come, you will be done, on earth as in heaven." He *will* return to rule on earth as He does in heaven, but sadly, for now, His rule on earth is often contested and even rejected. Nonetheless, His Kingdom is established and *will* reach perfect completion.



Jesus is unlike any other king, and His Kingdom is unlike any other kingdom. Earthly kingdoms expect their subjects to be prepared to lay down their lives; Christ the King of kings died for us.
