

"Alleluia! Christ is risen! - He is risen indeed. Alleluia!"

Down the centuries, Christians have celebrated the Resurrection with the great Easter proclamation: "Alleluia! Christ is risen! - He is risen indeed. Alleluia!" Perhaps because it's so well-known, we can take it for granted without noticing what we are proclaiming. After all, 'alleluia', which means 'praise God', is not an everyday word. 'Indeed' is more familiar, but even then we might not fully appreciate what it means. Looking online shows 'indeed' to mean: 'without a doubt, certainly' and 'in fact; in reality'. So, what the Easter proclamation is saying is: "Praise God! Christ is risen! - In fact, in reality, and without any doubt, He certainly is risen. Praise God!"

That's a mouthful to say, but it does make the point. The Easter message is that Jesus Christ, having died for us, rose from the dead and, in doing so, proved He is who He says He is and that the rest of the Gospel, the Good News of Jesus Christ, is true: You are deeply loved by God, no matter your past, Jesus did die for you and rose again so you can be forgiven and free. By trusting in Jesus, you are welcomed into God's family and restored to eternal life where you can live each day with hope, joy, and a renewed sense of purpose focused on sharing God's love and grace. If you are searching for meaning, longing for forgiveness, or just want a fresh start, Christ is risen, and the Good News of God's grace and salvation is available to everyone, including you.

The Apostle Paul, writing to the Corinthian Church, pointed out that "if Christ has not been raised, then our proclamation has been in vain, and your faith has been in vain". C.S. Lewis, the great Christian writer, said that "Christianity, if false, is of no importance, and if true, is of infinite importance. The only thing it cannot be is moderately important". In fact, in reality, and without any doubt, He certainly is risen, and therefore, Christian faith in the Good News of Christ's resurrection is not in vain and is as C.S. Lewis said, of infinite importance.

"Alleluia! Christ is risen! - He is risen indeed. Alleluia!"
