#### The miraculous catch of fish.

It is not difficult to imagine a fisherman not liking a carpenter telling him how to fish. After all, who likes to be told how to do

their job? However, following Jesus' instruction, Peter did let down the nets and a miraculous catch of fish was the result. This just shows us what simple obedience can achieve, even when a lack of faith, or doubt, gets in the way!



Peter, as an experienced fisherman knew something extraordinary was happening as the bulging nets were dragged out of the water. Recognising that God was at work convicted Peter of his own failings and inadequacy: "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!"

Letting go of thinking we know best, being broken by what God does, and being willing to do things God's way, is what Jesus looks for when He calls us to follow Him. Extraordinary things can happen when we do! *Martin*
