Jesus, looking at him, loved him

Today's Gospel reading contains one of my favourite phrases from scripture. Jesus, having discerned that a rich man's wealth was a block to following

Him, challenged the man to sell what he owned and give the money to the poor. Jesus knew this was more than the man would manage. Nevertheless,

and here's my favourite bit: "Jesus, looking at him, loved him".

We don't know what happened to the rich man. Who knows what effect Jesus' love had on him or how he might have responded in the future? Maybe there was no response, but even so Jesus still loved him.



"Jesus, looking at him, loved him". His love is unconditional and not dependent on what we are prepared to do for Him. Even in the face of our weakness and failure Jesus looks at us, loves us and never gives up on us.

Following Jesus means putting Him first. The man's inability to give up his wealth shows the challenge of putting Jesus first and fully trusting Him. It means letting go of the things we value more than we value Him. Often, we'd rather trust our wealth, possessions and our own abilities, holding onto them instead of trusting in God's unconditional love.

We can let go of our wealth and still be secure! Indeed, we *need* to let go to be *genuinely* secure, because true security is only found in the eternal life that is ours through Jesus and His unconditional love. *Martin*






Prayer Chain
