

Be Encouraged

In response to the disciples being impressed by the magnificence of the temple buildings, Jesus told his followers, "All will be thrown down". When

Peter, James, John, and Andrew wanted to know when that would be, Jesus didn't give them a date. Instead, He warned them of the wars, earthquakes and famine that were to come.

Even though Jesus didn't give any



dates, many people, like the disciples, are obsessed with future events and when they'll happen. Instead, of giving timelines, Jesus spoke to both warn and to encourage. He was telling them, and us, to be prepared for difficulties - to recognise that even the most troubling events can be used for God's purposes, and can even be seen as the "birth pangs" that are part of the coming of God's Kingdom 'on earth as it is in heaven'. By saying that what He was describing "must take place", Jesus showed that everything was under God's control. This should encourage us to trust in God's sovereignty and stay faithful in the present rather than worry about the future. Because of Jesus, we can face uncertain times with faith and hope.

Rather than be preoccupied by events, however troubling they may be, what Jesus said, as we hear from today's Gospel reading, calls us to stay alert and to focus on Him and the hope that is ours through Him. Martin

Somewhat ironically, given the events of this last week, this Sunday, the 17th of November, is Safeguarding Sunday. It's the annual date when churches are encouraged to focus on safeguarding. The theme for this year is 'Let's talk about it'. It's intended to encourage churches to have open and honest conversations about safeguarding.

In his resignation statement, Archbishop Justin Welby referred to 'personal and institutional responsibility'. His personal responsibility as Archbishop included responsibility for the whole of the Anglican Church and especially the Church of England. However, many people would have been aware, or had a degree of awareness, of the awful abuses perpetrated by John Smyth. It is too easy to assume that the responsibility for safeguarding is someone else's. Tragically, anyone who knew anything and didn't vigorously act, failed in their responsibilities to safeguard the victims of John Smyth.

The Archbishop's resignation in the week before Safeguarding Sunday gives us a shocking reminder that safeguarding is something we all share responsibility for. Furthermore, safeguarding in a Christian context is Gospel work. It is an expression of our love for God and each other and, in particular, of our obedience to the command to 'act justly, and to love mercy, and to walk humbly with your God'. I (Martin) therefore want to encourage us all, at the very least, to look at our Ascension Safeguarding web page, and consider how we can best fulfil the responsibility that is all of ours to safeguard those who are vulnerable. And then let's talk about it.
